Dr. Pijus Kanti Pal currently serves as a Research Fellow in the Indian Knowledge Systems Division (IKS Division) of the Ministry of Education, Government of India. With two and half years of dedicated service in the division. Dr. Pal earned his PhD from IIT Kharagpur, focusing on the Brāhmacaryāśramadharmā (Student Dharma) of the Indian Gurukula education system. He holds an M.A. in Sanskrit from Ramakrishna Mission Vidyamandira, Belur Math, a B.Ed from David Hare Teachers' Training College, Kolkata, and an MPhil in Sanskrit literature from Calcutta University. His primary research goal is to bridge ancient educational systems with modern pedagogical practices in the context of the National Education Policy 2020. Dr. Pal actively participates in promoting IKS initiatives through research and publication along with organizing and speaking in various workshops and seminars. He is also the chief convener of the Online IKS-TKDL Workshop, held quarterly by the IKS Division and the TKDL Unit. Previously, Dr. Pal taught at Surendranath College for Women in Kolkata and Tarakeswar Degree College in Hooghly. He is also engaged in teaching the Sanskrit language alongside Indian Knowledge Systems. Since 2018, he has been guiding over 15,000 Sanskrit learners worldwide as a Teaching Assistant for three NPTEL courses (Spoken Sanskrit: Basic, Intermediate & Advance) under the mentorship of Professor Anuradha Choudhry at IIT Kharagpur.
